1920's Eatons 1 Inch Web - Canada

This is a 1920's Eatons Department Store 1 inch web. Eatons was one of Canada's largest retailers. It features a blue & gold Eatons tag, but the writing is faint. There is a Z carved into button. Nice lining and feel. Very tough brand and beautiful overall condition.....\$225



1920's Champion Brand G107C 1 Inch Web

This is a youth model glove with great stampings. You can read every letter including Atlantic Leather Goods Co. stamped into the logo. It is in fantastic condition and features a perfect and very tough white & red Champion tag.....\$125



1920's Essex Brand International 1 Inch Web

This is one of two Essex Brand 1" webs and the nicer of the two. I upgraded to this one. It's in very nice condition. The stampings are great. Leather is a bit firm and has never been cleaned or conditioned.....\$175



1920's Bailey's Special 1 Inch Web

This is an extremely rare brand and the only Bailey's Special 1" web I have ever seen. It has block letter stampings in heel. The patent information and stamping is light. The leather is a bit alligatored.....\$125



1920's Excelsior 107 1 Inch Web

This is the cleanest Excelsior 1 inch web I have ever seen. It says Genuine horsehide. The logo and all the stampings are super bold. The lining and piping are perfect. This youth glove is in fantastic condition.....\$125



1920's Fairplay 107ND 1 Inch Web

This mid-sized glove or youth model glove features a near perfect black & gold tag. There's a mark or scratch on the bottom right front. Nice cloth piping. There is a stitch on seam on back of finger. My adult hand fits in it comfortably. Overall, this is one of the more difficult off-brands but lesser quality.....\$100



1920's Foremost S725 1 Inch Web

This is a youth sized glove in pretty nice condition. It's a little dry and has a couple of dark spots on back. It's the only Foremost 1" web I have ever cataloged. My adult hand fits in it comfortably. This is an extremely tough brand and has never been cleaned or conditioned.....\$75



1920's Fox Brand D53 1 Inch Web

This is perhaps one of the rarest 1" webs. It's a soft thin glove with logo stamped in palm. Logo features cross bats & Sport NY Goods. It's a cool logo. It's super soft inside and out and feels great. It's a plum/purple/black color. Fantastic glove.....\$125



1920's Gambles 58DG102 1 Inch Web

Big League Model. Nice stampings and probably one of the longer model numbers. It's a youth model featuring nice cloth piping and nice overall condition. My adult hand fits in it comfortably. A very decent glove overall and the only Gambles 1" web I have ever seen.....\$100



1920's Hiawatha A25-1957 1 Inch Web

This is a small or youth size glove with silver stampings in palm & heel. Every letter is completely visible. It features a very nice lining & piping. My adult hand fits in it just fine. It's the only Hiawatha 1" web I have ever seen.....\$75



1940's Babe Dahlgren D&M 651 Basemitt

A mid 1930's D&M Babe Dahlgren model 651 basemitt. It has seen use but is remarkably intact with the cloth patch and factory markings/endorsement on the face still readable. The mitt has soft supple leather inside and out and intact finger stall dividers. This rare "Glove Thumb" model is distinguished by the by-pass lacing that skirts the thumb along the back panel giving the mitt more flexibility. The factory trap style lacing has been adjusted by a former owner to obtain maximum reach, a feature eventually outlawed by MLB in the 1940's. This webbing resembles the "butterfly net" style favored by first sackers such as Hank Greenberg.....\$250



c. 1910 P. Goldsmith Sons Catchers Mitt

A circa 1910 Goldsmith catchers mitt. The mitt features two key Goldsmith patents, the 1905 web lacing and the interwoven belt style heel lacing of 1908. The reinforced pocket stitching and the early, fully intact "P. Goldsmith Sons" cloth patch also distinguish this mitt. The mitt is 10" in diameter and has rolled leather piping and an intact buckle and wrist strap.....\$225



c. 1940 Joe DiMaggio Spalding 107

A circa 1940 Spalding Joe DiMaggio model 107 glove in great shape. The rolled leather piping and inner liner are in stellar condition. This triple tunnel model is a huge glove with eye-catching factory stamps against the soft and supple black leather.....\$295

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1930's/40's Morris Arnovich George A. Reach

A 1930-40's Geo. Reach Morris Arnovich model WOW glove in close to near mint condition. It's a large, high quality glove. A beauty inside and out. Unimprovable factory markings, nice reddish brown leather contrasting with the yellow dyed leather wrist strap.....\$295



1940's Bucky Walters JC Higgins 1658

A J.C. Higgins Bucky Walters model 1658 glove in close to near mint condition. It's a buckle back model with double finger lacing. The condition of the leather inside and out is not improvable. A great on hand feel. It's a large glove typical of the day with rolled leather piping and overall high level of construction.....\$175



1950's Red Schoendienst MacGregor GC1

A 1950's MacGregor Red Schoendienst model GC1 glove in close to near mint condition. A really large, top of the line model in its day with the trademark "SpiderWeb". The glove leather is soft and supple inside and out. A perfect cloth patch.....\$195



1940's Joe Gordon Marathon 4207

A 1930-40's Marathon Joe Gordon model 4207 glove in near mint condition. This glove is first cabin all the way, large size, padded wrist strap, rolled leather piping, stellar factory markings and best of all, the glove retains much of its original form and supple leather condition. Tough to find a better example.....\$175

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c. 1952 Bob Lemon Nokona G54

A circa 1952 Nokona Bob Lemon model G54 glove. A rare model featuring the Nokona "Two Piece Palm" design. It may be the only model to surface to date with that particular feature. The glove itself is in great shape with very little wear. The pocket factory markings and cloth patch are great. The inner lining is smooth.....\$175

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Rawlings Heart of the Hide Pro-9FB Basemitt

This is as high quality as it gets. It's a huge, modern Heart of the Hide U.S. Pro. model. Rawlings is embroidered on thumb. The lining is nice and it's all original. It shows very little use and is ready for play. It just needs a light cleaning.....\$75



1940's Jimmie Foxx Spalding 151 Basemitt

As far as Double X models go, this is the model to have. The 151 is the most desirable Foxx model among glove collectors and on all the pre-war HOF want lists. This one is fantastic. The exterior leather is supple and the lining is great. The wrist strap and buckle have been expertly replaced.....\$275



1920's Playdays 62 905 Junior League Mitt

This little Junior League basemitt is impeccable. It's in fantastic shape and a not-so-common brand. It's definitely a youth mitt or toy commonly found in dime-stores many years ago. My adult hand fits in it just fine. I love this one.....\$100



1920's/30's Spalding 3 Finger

This pre-war 3 finger looks fine from the outside but the inner lining is very rough. It has never been conditioned and would shine up nicely. It's not perfect but a very affordable early 3 finger.....\$200



1910's/20's Stall & Dean Speed Model

This is one of the more desirable early Stall & Dean models. It's a big, full-sized top of the line Speed Model. The stampings are faint but there. The exterior leather is super soft and supple. The inner lining looks and feels nice when on the hand but has a hole in the thumb opening as well as under the piping of the middle finger. Feels good when on...\$225



1950's Mickey Mantle Rawlings XPG6 HOH

This one is broken in perfectly. It features the early style Mantle signature and the Heart of the Hide stampings are light but there. This one is ready to play catch. It has been expertly relaced and feels great. Has light name on back of pinky.....\$100



1940's Babe Ruth Spalding Canada

This is a mid-line model and the stampings are super light. It features a white and black Canadian Spalding tag. The lining is nice but has some dark spots on the front. Babe more visible than Ruth. Hard to see. This is a rare chance to own an affordable Ruth model due to the faint stampings.....\$200



1930's Rabbit Maranville

This tough pre-war HOF model is a great looking buckle back model but this one is a bit stiff and has a bad lining. The stampings are super light and the endorsement is almost non-existent.....\$100



1930's Reach

This is a nice quality Reach glove and probably a Babe Ruth model but it can't be proven as it is pretty worn. The lining is great. It features a Reach incised button and Reach tag. Nice condition but could use a thorough cleaning. Would make a great project or experiment glove or lining donor for the price.....\$50
