1920's D&M G24 1" Web Glove

You just don't come across gloves in this condition all that often. This gorgeous, seemingly unused 1920's Draper and Maynard white sewn web glove measures 8.0" from left to right and 9.0" from top to bottom. The D&M mascot, Nicodemus, is featured prominently on the front of the glove in the incredible palm stampings, on the beautiful black and gold patch on the back, and on the shiny silver and red wrist strap button.

Included with this amazing glove is a cool insert that D&M included with its gloves at the time titled, "A Letter to the Owner of This Glove" which featured a note from J.E. Maynard touting the quality of the glove the buyer was receiving. On the reverse side is a list of players who have used D&M gloves and mitts, including, of course, Babe Ruth.
